2. Minutes of Previous Meeting

3. Correspondence

Active Schools Funding

It is being proposed that schools no longer ask participants to pay for Active School programme to ensure that the activities are open to all pupils regardless of financial circumstances. However, feedback has been that less parent funding may result in fewer clubs. HTs are engaging with Active Schools to ensure that no child misses out (with a potential option that those who can pay will continue to). JS will find out more and revert

when she has more detail.

Leith Sea Scouts: Update

Leith Sea Scouts are proceeding with the Scout hall redevelopment and they are now going to be running local consultation on the renovations before they proceed. This may result in a delay and therefore put at risk the use of the scout hall for the next election day. HD will continue to offer all our support to the development.

Heart of Newhaven Gardening Project

Heart of Newhaven (the group who will be taking over the Victoria Primary school building) are planning a Gardening project - they have applied for funding for their growing food project. They would like to work with local schools on this project. JS has asked that they get

in touch.

4. HT Report:

Over the last couple of weeks there has been an increase in covid cases throughout Edinburgh. There is clear guidance to enable children to meet their new teachers and this will happen outside. Class bubbles will be maintained throughout. Short videos will also be uploaded for children and parents to help meet the teaching team. The children will not be able to visit their new classrooms.

The school will be receiving an additional 15% added to Pupil Equity Fund. The proposal is that the 3 schools in our cluster will combine the additional funding and use it to fund a new member of staff to take on many of the admin duties attached to the GIRFEC policy (Getting It Right for Every Child) The admin attached to running the GIRFEC is substantial for depute heads so this additional resource will free up significant time and allow the DHT to focus on teaching rather than admin.

A question arose regarding the annual Standardised National School Assessments (SNSA). These take place in P1, P4 and P7. The assessments are not aligned to the curriculum for excellence and do not produce a score. The assessments are not standardised because the questions change depending on how the child answers; children in the same class could therefore be answering different questions. The assessment results are primarily used by the school as a diagnostic tool for planning purposes.

5. Update on Arrangements for Next Session: Covid restrictions and School Times:

Based on current covid guidelines it's likely we will start the school year on the same basis as this term with 3 start times 8.30/8.45/9.00

However if guidelines change the school proposes to move to 2 start times

- All P1 & P2 times will be 9-3 (Mon Thurs) and 9-12 (Friday)
- P3-P7 will be 8.30 to 2.55pm (12.05 Friday)

There are 2.5 hours difference per week between teaching requirements for P1& P2 compared to the rest of the school years. Due to this there will always be a difference in start or end times. Breakfast club is available for families where the difference in timing may be problematic. It is recognised that there is no ideal solution so there will be further discussions on this when covid restrictions allow for change.

Every time there is a change of covid levels there is a change in school protocol so situation will be monitored over summer. Very likely that the August return will initially mirror the current school set up in terms of bubbles and staggered times.

Health & wellbeing

Priority will be on Health & Wellbeing in new term much as it has been this year. A lot of focus will likely still be required on operational logistics eg bubbles, cleaning, sanitiser

availability, safe movement around school.

Full plan will be shared in August 2021.

7. Rainbow School

The new school year will see the continuation of the Rainbow School where the school will continue its focus on diversity, equality and inclusion and will be encouraging pupils to focus on the values and skills that underpin what being a Rainbow school means. A range of community projects will be available for children to get involved with. All children will have

options open to them. Covid restrictions will shape what this will look like.

8. PC Review

Online has worked well for many allowing parents and carers to join when they otherwise couldn't. Restrictions allowing, it is proposed that meetings alternate between online and face to face. Option to allow parents/carers to join online, even when meeting is face to

face, are being considered.

Parent Council will consider how to engage a wider audience throughout the school on both

PC & PSA and whether more information online would be useful
