## Weekly Tasks

### Numeracy



Practise your times tables. Once you know your 2, 5 and 10 times tables, move onto 3, 4 or 6.

- e.g. count in the jumps (2, 4, 6 ...)
- say the times table in order ( $1 \times 2$  is 2,  $2 \times 2$  is 4...)
- answer questions in any order ( $2 \times 5$ ,  $2 \times 3$ ,  $2 \times 8$ ...)



### Reading Books

Read the school reading book daily

### Spelling

Look at the weekly spelling words, have fun learning to spell the words on your list



### Handwriting

Use letter formation sheet in home learning jotter as a guide to practise handwriting. Start letters correctly.

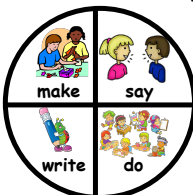


Complete 1 box per week, choose if you want to make, say, write or do to show your learning
