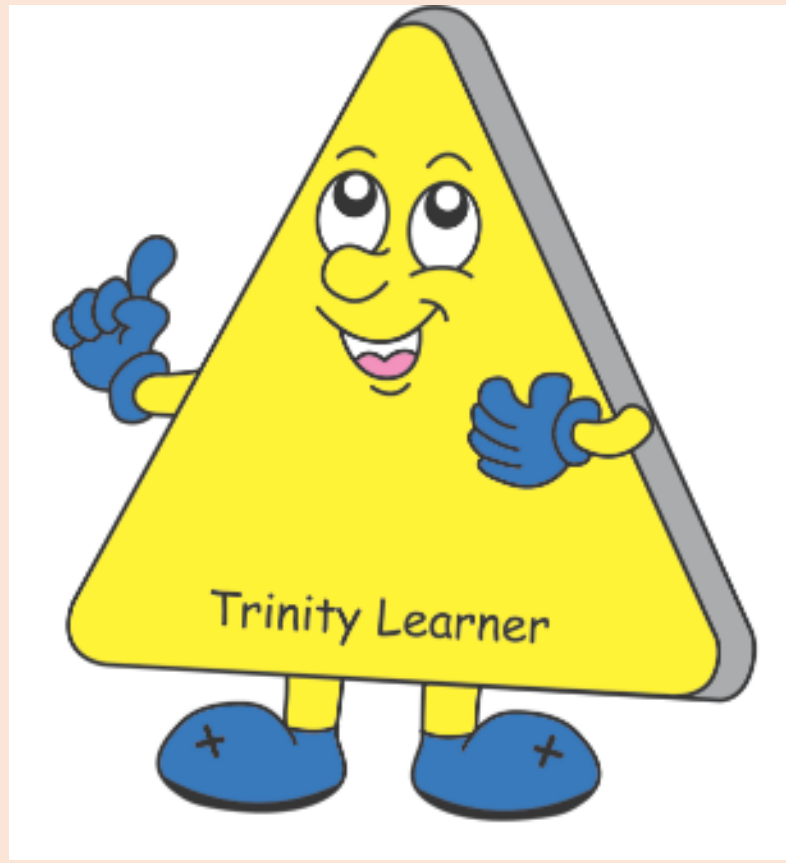
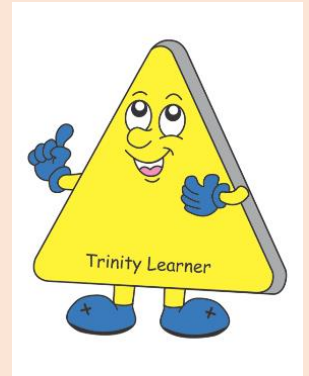




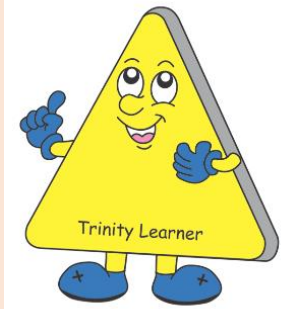
Learning in P1 at Trinity

Organisation



- Play-based learning approach with lots of choice
- Pupils will have focussed teaching time daily in small groups
- Balance of child initiated, adult initiated and adult led
- Focus on outdoor learning - literacy and numeracy throughout
- Flexible seating plan

Phonological Awareness

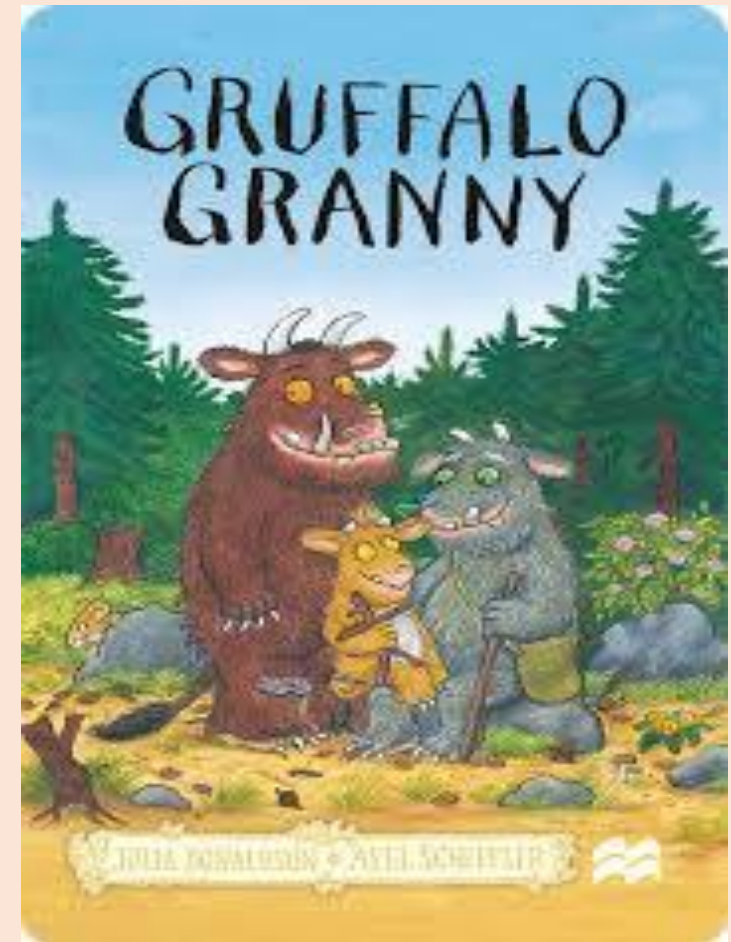


First few weeks of P1

- Focus on a theme a week - farm, space
- **Word Level:** Hearing and counting individual words in a spoken sentence
- **Syllable Level:** Identifying and splitting the "beats" or chunks in a multi-syllable
- **Onset - Rime** - Recognising the initial consonant sound (onset) and the vowel-and-consonant part that follows (rime) in a single syllable
- **Phonemic Awareness:** The most advanced level, which focuses on tuning in to the individual, smallest units of sound (phonemes)

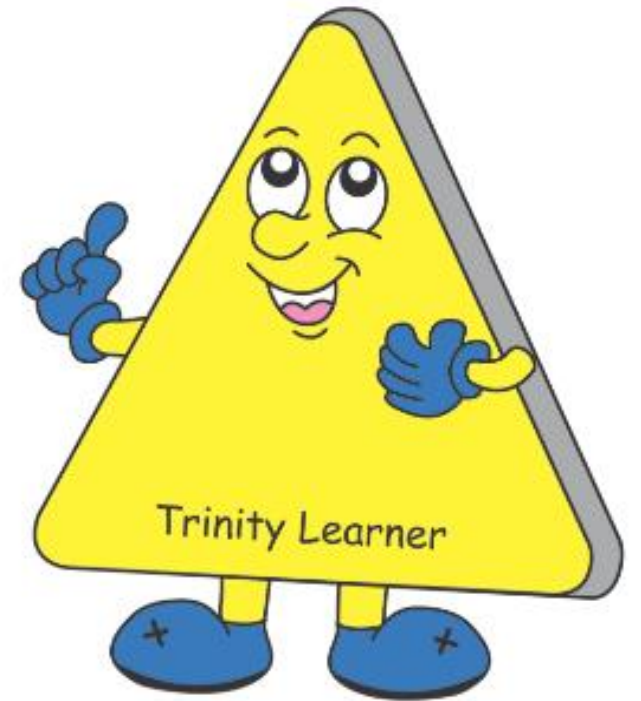
How can you help?

- Read with your child, picture book/story book, ask questions about the story (describe the character, sequencing, rhyme, sounds).



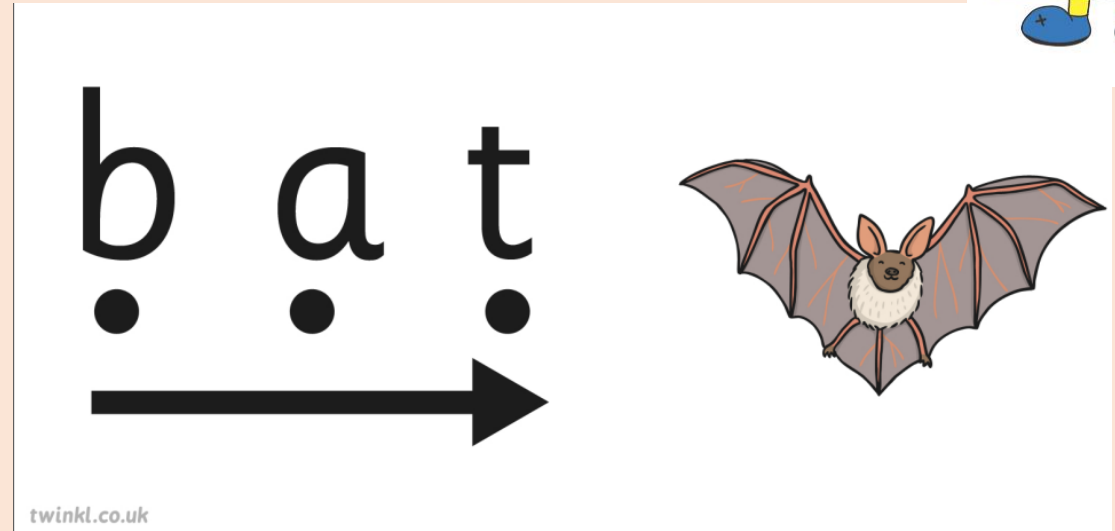
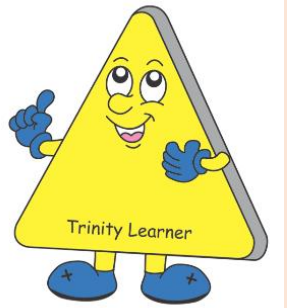
How do we teach phonics?

- **Phonics** involves matching those spoken sounds to **printed letters** and spelling rules to read and write
 - Sound not name
 - blending/segmenting
 - c- a- t
 - sh-o-p



How can you help at home?

- Use the letter sound, not the name
- Suggested activities
 - Flashcards
 - Build words
 - What begins with...?
 - Treasure hunt
 - Bath letters/bath crayons



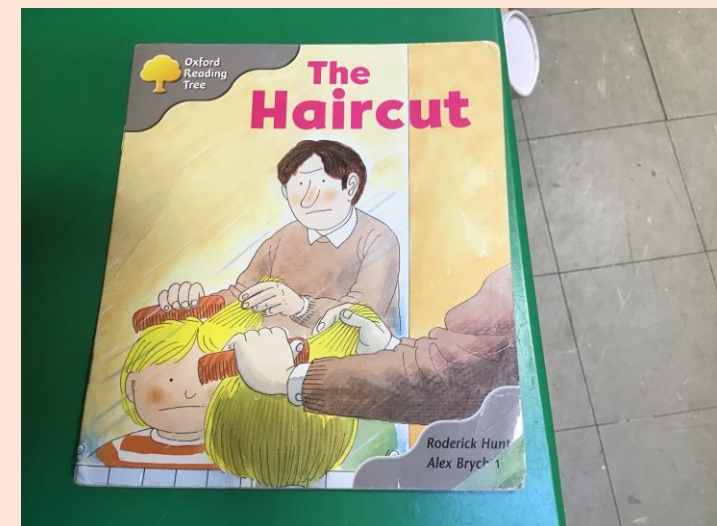
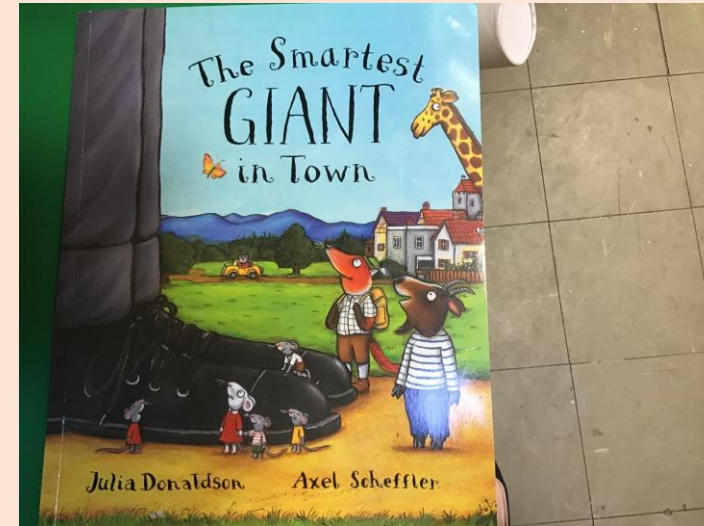
Writing

- Range of genres

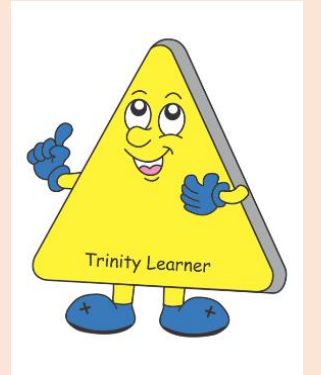


Reading

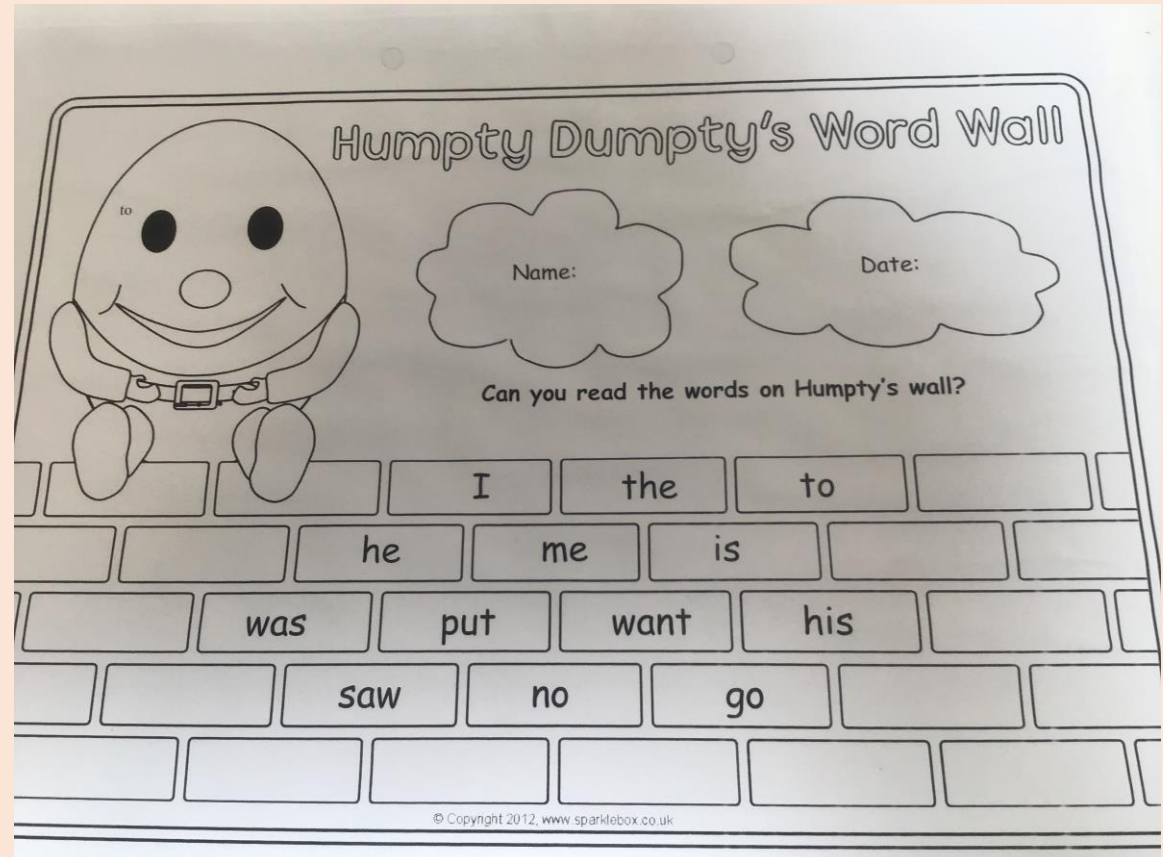
- Story books to share at home

- PRACTISE, PRACTISE, PRACTISE!



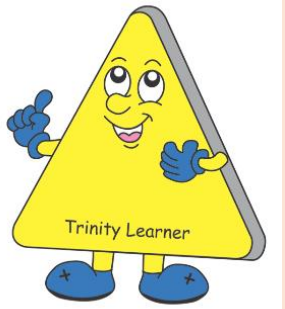
Numeracy

- Teaching of number skills, knowledge and understanding of the counting system

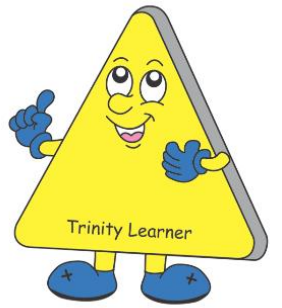

How can you help at home?



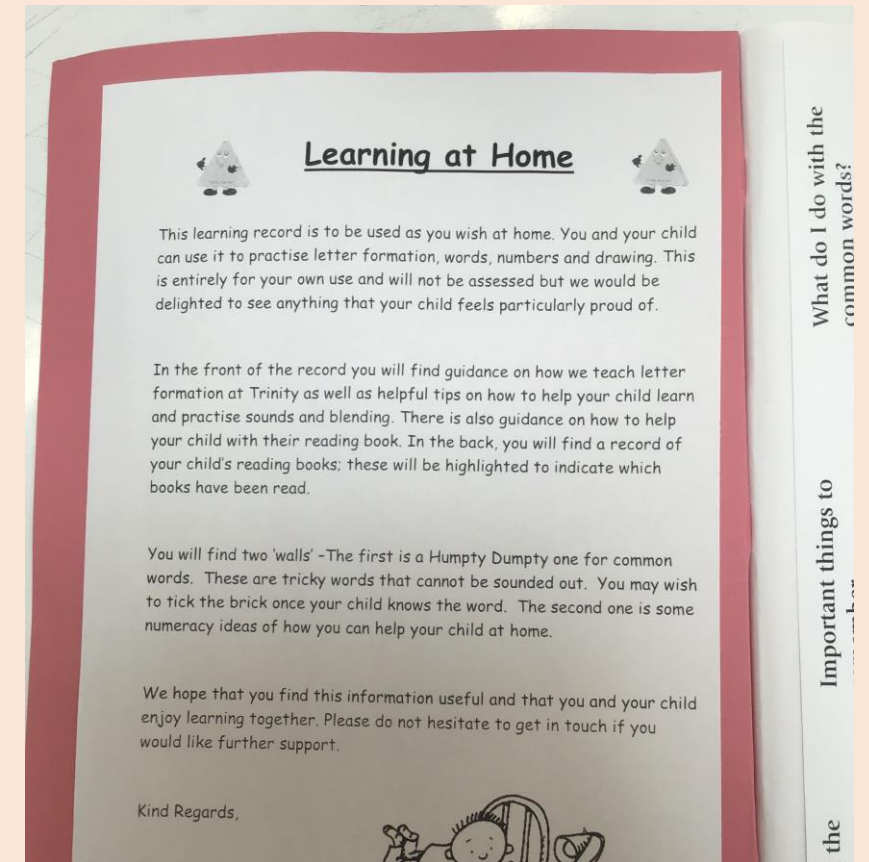
- Count everything - cutlery, going up and down stairs
